
Leaders: George Washington

Uniforms and Flags

UNIFORMS

This is something all the soldiers on the Patriots side should know. Our uniforms are blue over coats with a white/tan outline. Underneath is a tan button-up vest. You can wear black, tan, or white pants. You will wear calf high white or tan socks. You will wear leather black boots and a 3 cornered hat.

GEORGE

WASHINGTON'S UNIFORM

George Washington is going to wear a dark blue over coat, with a tan button-up vest and tan pants. He will wear a 3-cornered hat, with blackish blue boots. If you see a person, and you can't find George, just look for his uniform. It is almost like yours, but it's different here and there.

OUR FLAG

Our flag has 13 stripes to represent or 13 colonies. It has 13 stars to also represent our 13 colonies. The colors are red, white, and blue. White stars, and red and white stripes, and a blue square in the left hand corner, with those white stars. Never wave this flag, do not surrender! Wave it in pride in joy, after the war is over and we won. Do not surrender! We can win!
